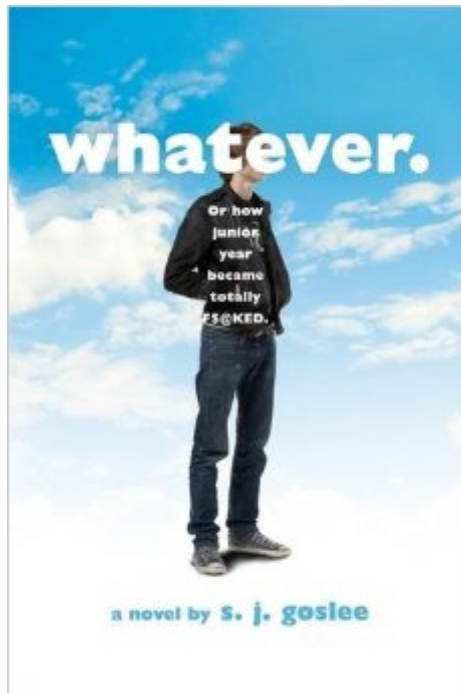

This book is narrated in Mike's voice, and he's an extremely likable narrator, which I think is why this book is so fun to read, even though it tackles some heavier issues like coming out as a teenager - something probably never easy even if one has a great circle of friends and loving family. Mike sees the good in everybody, and that makes it easier for me as a reader to see the good in Mike (because he's likable, but he also smokes weed and drinks and lazes around and is happy with getting C grades, all things which my straight-laced little soul cringes at). And there is a lot of good in Mike - he's a supportive friend to all his friends, he's a great older brother, a good son, a very good sport, and super soft-hearted. He is also smart, funny, and has a goofy self-awareness of his own teenage angst that carries him through his problems. A lot of emotional stuff happens closer to

the end of the book, and I did get a little teary-eyed, but it was in the best way, and this is one of those really good teenage coming-of-age books.
